Regarding the **Directive 2011/65/EU** on the restriction of use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment (**RoHS**) and subsequent amendments, **Valtaro Motori S.r.l.** headquartered in Antonella Cavatorta, declares that:

in compliance with European Directive in object, the components used in our production have values of the maximum concentrations tolerated by weight in homogeneous materials lower than what is written in Table 1.

According to the previous statements Valtaro Motori S.r.l. maintains active the necessary actions enabling the company to ensure the continuity of the supply chain. Specifically:

- updating the necessary information with reference to the evolution of the RoHS Directive;
- searching for alternative suppliers with the aim of ensuring the continuity of supply;
- promoting the research and development of alternative processes or substances in order to guarantee to our customers the continuity, the quality and the performances of the supplied products;

Lead	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material*
Mercury	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material*
Cadmium	0,01% by weight in homogeneous material*
Hexavalent chromium	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material *
Polybrominated biphenyls (PBB)	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material *
Polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE)	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material *
Bis(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP)	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material **
Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP)	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material **
Dibutyl phthalate (DBP)	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material **
Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP)	0,1% by weight in homogeneous material **

* "homogeneous material" means one material of uniform composition throughout or a material, consisting of a combination of materials, that cannot be disjointed or separated into different materials by mechanical actions such as unscrewing, cutting, crushing, grinding and abrasive processes;

**Introduced by Commission Delegated Directive 2015/863/EU. The restriction of DEHP, BBP, DBP and DIBP shall apply from 22 July 2019 and to medical devices and monitoring and control instruments, including industrial monitoring and control instruments, from 22 July 2021.
